

Dr. John Krauss rites set for today

Funeral services for Dr. John M. "Jack" Krauss, 60, will be conducted at 11 a.m. today (Thursday, Feb. 28) at Palmdale Masonic Lodge 769, A&FM. The Rev. Michael Moran of St. Mary's Catholic Church will deliver the eulogy. Interment will follow at Desert Lawn Memorial Park. The

Dr. Krauss, who succumbed to a heart attack in Lancaster Monday, Feb. 25, had been a physician in the Valley since 1947. He was born March 26, 1919, in Michigan.

He was also active in many community organizations and had

been Vice Mayor of the City of Palmdale with a number of years on the City Council. He was a member of the Palmdale Planning Commission at the time of his death.

Dr. Krauss is survived by his wife, Betty Krauss, of the family home; his mother, Mrs. Lela Krauss, also of Palmdale; five children, Jon R. Krauss of Loveland, Colorado; Tom W. Krauss of Los Angeles; Linda Krauss of Tennessee; Elizabeth McElroy of San Diego; Beverly A. Potter of Escondido;

Two sisters, Mabel Tholman of Maine; Norma Jean Nelson of Oregon; five grandchildren and numerous nieces and nephews.
