

Alfonso Minghelli rites Monday

Alfonso Minghelli of Palmdale, a resident of Antelope Valley for almost 30 years, died Nov. 18, in the Loma Linda University Hospital. He was 91.

Requiem mass will be held at St. Mary's Church in Palmdale tomorrow, Nov. 23, at 10 a.m. with Rev. Michael Moran the officiant and burial in Desert Lawn Memorial Park. Chapel of the Valley Mortuary in Palmdale is in charge of arrangements and visitation hours are today from 1 until 7 p.m.

Mr. Minghelli was born in the mountains of northern Italy Sept. 2, 1890 and migrated to Chicago in 1911. After leaving Chicago, he worked in Colorado coal

mines moving to California where he met and married Inez Maida in Los Angeles Oct. 30, 1919.

Mr. Minghelli established his own concrete company in Baldwin Park but for health reasons he and his family moved to Antelope Valley in 1952.

In addition to his wife, Inez, of Palmdale, also surviving are five sons, Bruce R., Edward and Leonard A. Minghelli of Palmdale, Neil Minghelli of Sacramento and Albert P. Minghelli of Tucson; two daughters, Mrs. Clorinda A. Evans of Palmdale and Mrs. Elizabeth E. Borchers of Sacramento; 26 grandchildren and 22 great grandchildren.
