Jack B. Terry Is Killed in Accident, Lancaster, June 7

Buried at Services at Lancaster Yesterday Afternoon

One young man, Jack Terry, of Lancaster, was killed and another Lancaster youth was injured in an automobile accident Monday night, June 7th, just before midnight, at the intersection of Ave 20 West and 10th St. Funeral services for Mr. Terry were held yesterday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock at the Mumaw Funeral Home, in Lancaster, with Rev. R. W. Plannette officiating, and burial was in the Lancaster Cemetery.

According to the report of the injured youth, Deward Humphreys, 16, the accident occurred as Terry who was driving at a very high rate of speed, failed to make the turn at the end of the road. The car skidded and rolled over for a distance of about 74 feet. Terry was killed instantly. Humphreys received cuts on his forehead and scalp and a minor concussion, and is a patient at the Byrne Hospital in Lancaster, where his injuries are not considered serious. The car was badly damaged; it belonged to a brother of Terry.

Johannes Basil Terry was born in 1910 in Oklahoma, so was 26 years of age at the time of his death. He had been working in the Valley for about two years. His father and mother, who live at the George Lane ranch, and two or three brothers and sisters survive.
