## Services Held for Old Time Resident

Daniel Curtis, one of Antelope Valley's earliest settlers died Monday afternoon, August 30, 1943 in Los Angeles. He had gone to Los Angeles about two months ago to be at his daughter's home and had also spent some time in a Los Angeles Sanitarium because of failing health.

Mr. Curtis was born May 4, 1862 and was married to Miss Anna Pleake July 16, 1883. In 1891, Mr. and Mrs. Curtis came to California and in 1892, he moved to Antelope Valley and since that time has lived in the Valley. For a number of years they made their home on a ranch in the Fairmont district and on their retirement moved to Lancaster, where they had since lived.

Four children were born, George, Frank, Lyman, and Adah. Only one, Mrs. Adah Greene survives with the widow. Two grandchildren are also living. Curtis Greene, Los Angeles is now a United States Marine, stationed somewhere in the South Pacific and Danny Curtis of Lancaster is with the United States Army and is now at Marion, Ohio.

In spite of the tragic deaths of his three sons, Mr. Curtis was of particularly sunny disposition, never burdening others with his troubles and always cheerful in his associations with his family and friends.
