

Albert A. Jones was born in Brown City, Michigan, February 8, 1859. In boyhood he moved with his parents to a place near Perry, Iowa, where he lived until his marriage. He was united in marriage to Verona Carter, June 16, 1888, and they made their home at Canton, Iowa, for three years. They moved to Minnesota where they resided for four years and then to North Dakota, where Mr. Jones engaged in farming and coal mining for twelve years. From North Dakota he moved to Canada and lived there for three years. In 1913 the family moved to Palmdale, where he remained to the time of his demise.

He is survived by his wife and four children: Mrs. Lewis Ready, Alberta, Canada, Howard Jones, Earl Jones and Mrs. Allen West, a sister, Mrs. Genevieve Mourer, of Los Angeles, and two brothers, Will and Art Jones, both living in Iowa.

Interment was had at the Palmdale cemetery to which place a large train of his friends followed his remains that they might join the last impressive ceremonies of laying him in his final resting place.

The floral pieces were rich and profuse, filling the entire space in front of the church rostrum, these attesting his high standing in the community.
