

Mrs. Jack (Stella) Bones funeral set for Thursday

Funeral services for Stella O. Bones, 58-year-old wife of one of Antelope Valley's leading citizens, Jack Bones Sr., of Littlerock, will be held at 11 a.m. Thursday at Mumaw Funeral Home, Lancaster.

Interment will follow in Desert Lawn Memorial Park, Palmdale, with Rev. Clyde E. Ervin, First United Methodist Church of Palmdale, officiating.

Mrs. Bones, born Jan. 22, 1917, in Hatch, N.M., died Sept. 27 at City of Hope, Duarte, Calif., climaxing a short illness.

Mrs. Bones first moved to California in 1928 and had been a resident of Antelope Valley since 1935.

Her husband, whom she married Oct. 23, 1940, in Las Vegas, Nev., is a native of Antelope Valley and prominent Littlerock rancher. Mr. Bones is also a member of the Antelope Valley Fair board and chief of staff of the Los Angeles County sheriff's mounted posse, one of the largest search and rescue organizations in Southern California.

Immediate survivors, besides her husband, include a daughter, Judy Zickhur, Freewater, Ore., and a son, Jack Bones Jr., Littlerock, and her mother, B. Rae Anderson, of Maywood, Calif.

Also surviving are three

sisters, Dale Schrader, Littlerock, Rae Cahn, San Francisco, and June Brady, Lubbock, Tex., and a brother, Frank Nipp, Anaheim, Calif.

Other survivors include two grandsons and two granddaughters, and several nieces and nephews.
