
Joseph Hutak Is Taken in Death After Long Illness

Successful Juniper Hills Rancher Buried Tuesday

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at 2:00 at Mumaw's Chapel in Lancaster for Joseph Hutak, successful rancher of Juniper Hills, whose death occurred last Friday, November 4, following an illness of several months. Interment was in the Lancaster Cemetery.

Mr. Hutak, who homesteaded his ranch at the base of the high mountains in Juniper Hills about twenty years ago, was an industrious hard working rancher, developing his property carefully and making a success of his poultry-raising and other farming activities. He was also an expert carpenter, and had constructed many buildings in that neighborhood.

Mr. Hutak was forty-eight years of age at the time of his death. He was a native of Austria, but had lived in the United States and in California about twenty-nine years.

He is survived by his widow, and their one son, Joe F. Hutak, who is a ranger in the U.S. Forestry Service, stationed the other side of the mountains.
