

Laura Bel Redman Passes in L. A.; Moved to AV in 1911

Laura Bel Redman of Lancaster died Saturday, September 6, in Los Angeles. She was 79 years old and had been ill for the last five months. She has been a resident of Antelope Valley since 1911.

Funeral services were held Wednesday, September 10, at 10 a.m. at the Mumaw Funeral Home in Lancaster. She was laid to final rest at the Lancaster Cemetery. Rev. Norvall Pickett of the First Baptist Church conducted the service.
