

Friends Mourn Pioneer Mrs. Rawley Duntley

Funeral services were conducted Tuesday for Mrs. Rawley Duntley, 70, a resident of Antelope Valley for the past 65 years.

Mrs. Duntley died May 25 following a brief illness. At the time of her death she resided with her husband at Center Street and Sierra Highway in Rosamond. The Duntleys made their home for five years north-east of Palmdale. In 1910 they bought the Oak Creek Ranch near Tehachapi where they remained for 45 years.

Mrs. Duntley served as president of Native Daughters of the Golden West, Desert Gold Parlot, Mojave, and was a member of Tehachapi Woman's Club.

She leaves her husband and four children, Mrs. Marjorie Stitt of Mojave, Lawrence Duntley of Rosamond, Mrs. Myrtle Davis of Lancaster, and Mrs. Anna G. Freeman, Adelanto; nine grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

Services were conducted at Maumaw Funeral Home by the Rev. Fred Cottriell, Lancaster.

Rawley Duntley is known from one end of California to the oth-

er as the barbecue king. Each year he prepares and serves his famed cuisine at Sacred Heart Church in Lancaster, and the prepared giant barbecues for hundreds of other organizations in the past half-century.
