

Funeral Conducted for Two Victims of Gas Poisoning

Funeral services were held Monday in Mumaw Chapel for Primitero Hualde, 56, and Ildefonso Garde, 65, farm laborers, who met accidental death Jan. 31 in their cabin on the Blas Gor-rindo Ranch, west of Lancaster.

The Rev. Fred Cottriel of the Assembly of God Church officiated.

Interment for Mr. Garde took place in Joshua Memorial park. Mr. Hualde was buried in Lancaster Cemetery.

The two workers were found dead in their cabin at 46148 W. 100th Street Friday morning, it was reported by Lancaster sheriff's deputies.

The men were found by Auspicio Zamboran, another employee, who told deputies the gas heater was on in the bedroom and the water was running in the sink.

The body of Mr. Garde was discovered standing at the sink with head and arms submerged and the water running. Mr. Hualda was seated in a chair nearby. All doors and windows in the dwelling were closed, deputies reported.

Mr. Garde, a resident of Antelope Valley since 1939, was a native of Ysaba, Spain, where he was born Jan. 22, 1892. He is survived by a brother and sister-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Azor Garde of Hayward and three nieces and three nephews living in Spain.

Mr. Hualde, a resident of Antelope Valley since 1934, also was a native of Ysaba. He is survived

by two brothers, Angel Hualde of Phoenix, and Emilio Hualde of Ysaba and two nephews, Rufino and Angel Hualde of Phoenix.
