N. F. Rader Services Conducted

Funeral services for Norman Floyd Rader, 44, former resident of Palmdale and recently of Palm Springs, were held Feb. 11 at Mumaw Funeral chapel with the Rev. John G. Bennett, assistant pastor of First Presbyterian Church in Palmdale officiating.

Mr. Rader, a restaurant chef, died Feb. 6 of a cerebral hemorrhage. He had been ill for a year.

Born Sept. 24, 1913, in Rader, Mo., Mr. Rader moved to the Valley in 1930. A veteran with a rating of sergeant, Mr. Rader served with the Second Armored Division in the European campaign in World War II.

Injuries suffered during his period of service were the cause of his illness, it was stated.

While in Palmdale he operated the Palmdale Inn and the White Spot Cafe.

He is survived by two children, a daughter, Donna Lee Rader, and a son, Norman Gary Rader, both of Palmdale. He leaves four sisters, Mrs. John D. Perkins of Palmdale, Mrs. Dante Simi and Mrs. Logan White of Lancaster, and Mrs. Earl Vestal of Niangua, Mo. Two brothers also survive, J. C. Rader of Conway, Mo., and Fred Rader of Tulsa, Okla.
