

Passing of Leo R. Lintemoot Marked By His Community

The untimely passing of Leo Raymond Lintemoot on March 30, 1950, at his home in Littlerock came suddenly, as the result of a heart ailment. A man with an established place in his community, his absence will be marked by many.

Leo Lintemoot was born in Van Wert County, Ohio, on November 24, 1894. He was a cabinet maker by trade. He first came to California in 1923, settling in the Antelope Valley in 1924.

In 1927 he married Mrs. Mary C. Rogers, mother of four small children. Lintemoot was president of the Keppel Union School Board for several terms. For 15 years he drove the school bus, retiring in 1946.

He was a charter member of the Alpine Grange, and a member of the Littlerock Chamber of Commerce. He served as a leader of the Littlerock 4-H Club for several years, and became leader of the Alpine 4-H group which was formed in 1950.

Loved Children

Throughout his career his major interest was in children, and he was ever an enthusiastic supporter of all youth groups. One of his characteristic activities was playing the part of Santa Claus for Littlerock community activities, which he did for over a period of 15 years.

Funeral services were held for him on Saturday, April 1, in Mumaw's chapel, with Rev. Gilbert Wantland officiating. He was laid to rest in the Palmdale Cemetery.

Besides his wife, Mrs. Mary Rogers Lintemoot, he leaves five children: a son, Dan Martin Lintemoot, and Stanley, LuEddie, and Randolph Rogers of Littlerock, and Raymond Rogers of Santa Barbara. There are also five grandchildren in Santa Barbara, and one great-grandson in Littlerock.
